# 15.1 20mph speed limit in Bean

**15.2** Southfleet Road pedestrian crossing for access to Beacon Woods Unfortunately, the bid to KCC to provide a crossing and associated works was unsuccessful. However, on 24<sup>th</sup> February Cllr. Munday met with

representatives from National Highways, Atkins and Bean Primary School to discuss the following:-

# Designated Funds Beacon Park Crossing Feasibility Study

National Highways advised that they had secured funding for a crossing and a number of options were discussed and the comments by both the School and Bean Parish Council were taken into account.

Following the completion of the feasibility study National Highways will have to evaluate the value for money associated with the different options and the stakeholder views and will make the ultimate decision as to which option could be justified to be taken forward when compared with other applications made by other schemes outside the Bean area.

# 15.3 Sandy Lane – water leak

It was noted that there is an extensive water leak in Sandy Lane which reaches Park Corner Road in Betsham which has been reported to Thames Water.

# 15.4 Sandy Lane – overhanging tree

It was noted that near to the entrance of Claywood Lane there is a tree which has been dislodged and is now overhanging the road. KCC Highways have been informed.

# 17 Footpaths

#### 17.1 DR25

Following reports of motor bikes and quad bikes accessing the footpath from Betsham the PROW Officer has agreed to install kissing gates at the entrance to DR25 from behind Broomhills (Betsham).

# 18 Beacon Woods

# 18.1 HE Landscaping project in Beacon Woods

The original oak bollards surrounding the first car-park have been removed and replaced with smaller soft-wood bollards. FoBW have raised concerns that they now constitute a tripping hazard and this has been raised with Balfour Beatty/National Highways.

# 18.2 Damage to external fencing caused by vehicle

On 29<sup>th</sup> November a vehicle left the road, crossed the verging and damaged a section of the external fencing. The insurance claim was settled in full on 18<sup>th</sup> February 2022 and the repairs to the fencing have been completed.

#### 18.3 Refurbishment of hardstanding pathways

On  $27^{th}$  January the Clerk met with a representative of Tilhill to discuss the refurbishment of 2 of the main hardstanding pathways -1) The main path which passes the memorial benches to NP-C and stretches from the junction with the blue route to Shellbank. 2) The pathway from the bottom of the steps near the pedestrian entrance opposite the shop to the

junction by the memorial bench to AJS. The other paths were also walked and quotations requested.

Ouotations have been received as follows, excl.VAT:

Full re-instatement of the paths as indicated on the quotation £123,951.09 Pathways to be topped up with a new surface only. £96,107.79

#### **RESOLVED:**

That funding streams for the footpath improvement project be sought.

# 18.4 Damage caused by falling trees during storm weather.

- **18.4.1** Two large fallen stems hung over Southfleet Road were removed 3<sup>rd</sup> March as they were a danger to traffic. Cost £240 (incl VAT) has been paid by FoBW.
- 18.4.2 Large Multi stem Ash fallen from within the woods landing in a resident's garden. Quotation received to cut up and deposit the arisings over the fence back into the woods. Leave timber against the fence, cut as manageable large sizes. £800 + VAT.

  Matter passed to our insurance company.
