

## Bean Recreation Ground, Junior Play Area COVID-19 Risk Assessment

Bean Parish Council own and manage Bean Recreation Ground, which consists of Junior Play Area, Toddler Play Area, Outdoor Gym and an open grassed area used for football and other ball games. This RA concerns the Junior Play Area.

Bean Parish Council has volunteers who carry out weekly visual inspections of the equipment and empty the litter bins. General repairs are carried out by the Parish Handyman or when required an approved play-ground equipment supplier. The grass is cut and strimmed under an annual contract with Yeomans (Landscape Services). Play Inspection carry out quarterly inspections including risk assessments.

Risks are associated with all users and contractors.

The risk rating balances the likelihood of a given risk with impact of the risk in question and results in an overall risk rating, as well as a RED (not acceptable), AMBER (reasonably acceptable/action may be required), GREEN (reasonable acceptable/no action required, review) colour indication.

Hand sanitiser that is effective against covid-19 is not suitable for use in a children's setting.
