## **BEAN PARISH COUNCIL**

The COVID-19 Coronavirus pandemic and the unprecedented Government measures in response to the crisis (e.g. prohibitions on gatherings, social distancing, self-isolation and shielding of those deemed to be the most vulnerable) have meant that the requirement for local authorities to hold public meetings in person with all members present in one place cannot currently be met. The statutory requirements for meetings are mainly contained in the Local Government Act 1972 ("the 1972 Act") and the Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act 1960 ("the 1960 Act"). In recognition of the difficulties of holding and attending meetings, the Government included s.78 in the Coronavirus Act 2020 and provided the Secretary of State with the power to make Regulations for the provision of holding alternative format meetings.

As such, this meeting will be held under terms agreed by Members being to conduct the Council business via internet link.

Additionally, the legislation allowed for the cancellation of the Annual Parish Council meeting and all current appointments continue until 7 May 2021.

# 5.1 Death of Prince Phillip, Duke of Edinburgh 1921 -2021

The following announcement was placed on the Council website.

Following the sad news that His Majesty the Duke of Edinburgh had passed away on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> April 2021 the thoughts of the residents of Bean Parish are with the Royal Family as they grieve for their Father, Grandfather and Great-Grandfather.

The Duke demonstrated extraordinary dedication and commitment to duty throughout the Queen's reign and did so with strength and admirable determination. He supported Her Majesty throughout decades of change, from the dark post war years through to the new horizons of the 21st century, enabling her to provide essential continuity for the nation.

In accordance with government guidance, we were advised that the online book of condolence opened on the Royal family's official website royal.uk should be the sole portal for the public to express personal tributes. Residents who wished to lay flowers during the mounting period were advised that they might do so at the Bean memorial at the entrance to the village and to please follow the COVID rules. Residents were asked that all/any plastic wrap should be removed before laying flowers. At the end of the mourning period, from 9am the day following the funeral (Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> April 2021), floral tributes will be removed and suitably located to decompose.

A written letter of condolence has been sent on behalf of Bean Parish to Brigadier Archie Miller-Bakewell, Private Secretary to His late Royal Highness, The Duke of Edinburgh, Buckingham Palace, London, SW1A 1AA

Flowers will be removed from the Bean Memorial on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> April 2021 in accordance with the above instructions.

## 5.2 Annual Meeting of the Parish Council

The following communication has been received from Luke Hall MP, Minister of State for Regional Growth and Local Government at the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government with regard to Local Authority Meetings.

The Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020 do not apply to meetings on or after 7 May 2021.

Extending the regulations to meetings beyond May 7 would require primary legislation. The Government has considered the case for legislation very carefully, including the significant impact it would have on the Government's legislative programme which is already under severe pressure in these unprecedented times. We are also mindful of the excellent progress that has been made on our vaccination programme and the announcement of the Government's roadmap for lifting Covid-19 restrictions. Given this context, the Government has concluded that it is not possible to bring forward emergency legislation on this issue at this time.

While I appreciate that a greater number of authorities will be subject to elections this year due to the postponement of the 2020 elections, those councils who are not subject to elections could also consider conducting their annual meetings prior to 7 May, and therefore do so remotely while the express provision in current regulations apply.

In view of the above the Chair moved that the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council be brought forward from Monday 10<sup>th</sup> May to one of the following dates of the Council's choosing, Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> or Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> May 2021.

A Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) is a formal conservation designation. Usually, it describes an area that's of particular interest to science due to the rare species of fauna or flora it contains - or even important geological or physiological features that may lie in its boundaries.  SSSIs often contain important habitats such as grasslands, parkland and woodland. Some even contain ancient woodland and ancient trees. In other words, these areas have high conservation value, and need to be protected.	
At a recent meeting with EDC, Bean PC asked how people could safely enter the Garden City from Bean and also raised the importance of local families being able to access the parks, facilities, community spaces etc on offer there safely on foot or by bike. BPC also asked if there were any plans for access routes from Bean into the Garden City.  EDC have responded that as part of the Eastern Quarry Development the developer is obliged to provide a pedestrian route from/to the southern development access on Watling Street to (not including) the Sandy Lane underpass including a traffic signal-controlled crossing across Watling Street. Ebbsfleet Development Corporation and Highways England will upgrade the Sandy Lane underpass and other routes along Watling Street to ensure good access into Eastern Quarry.  BPC has been asked if the Council would like a representative from EDC to attend a future meeting to discuss cycle paths, walkways, the Bean Triangle work, etc.

Improvements in Bean Country Park, primarily associated around the entrance closest to the school to improve direct safe access to the floor of the former quarry along with some signs/way-markers and minor improvements to the car park entrance.

Atkins considered that Beacon Wood Country Park offered an opportunity to provide some creative concepts which it was hoped would be very much in keeping with the character and works previously undertaken by the volunteers. This initially included the provision of additional litter bins and picnic tables but members pointed out that additional bins would require emptying by volunteers and this would not be practical and the site chosen for a 2<sup>nd</sup> picnic area, near to the entrance from Shellbank, becomes waterlogged for 5 months of the year and is therefore unsuitable. Mention was also made of installing additional benches similar to those in memory of former councillors but it was felt by members that those seats had been chosen specifically for their individuality and any additional benches should be of a different style.

Members were, however, very impressed with the suggestion to improve access to the woods from the pedestrian entrance opposite the school but reminded Atkins that any improvements must meet with Tarmac's, the landowner, approval.

## 16 Environmental Issue

- **16.1** Southfleet Parish Council's response to BPC's offer of financial assistance to install CCTV cameras in Sandy Lane was noted.
- **16.2** The Clerk apprised members on the latest communications with a resident at Hope Cottages regarding littering.
- 16.3 It was noted that fly-tipping along Sandy Lane is now being set alight.

## 17 Footpaths

17.1 The major tree work on DR22 has been completed. The final clear-up of the section of DR22 behind Foxwood will take place later this month and will not include major tree work.

On the South side of the footpath, they will be reducing the hawthorns and understory vegetation to fence height and disposing of dumped debris and other vegetative matter dumped by residents.

On the North side they will removing and disposing of dumped debris and logs and clearing and coppicing the elderberries at the Drudgeon end of the footpath.
